NYSDOH Interim Guidance for Day Camp Programs During the Covid-19 Public Health Emergency were lifted June 15, 2021. Camp Malta procedures will be as follows:

- Children will still be placed in a static group of campers and 2-3 counselors for the entire week. The different groups will have no or minimal contact with the other groups at camp.
- The bus will make separate trips to the park, only transporting one group at a time
- Children are not required to wear a mask during the camp day. All counselors/staff have been vaccinated.
- Health screenings and temperature checks will not be conducted.

Program Plans for the week include crafts, sports, playground time and numerous indoor and outdoor games. There's always lots going on! We have planted a garden in the Community Garden behind the Malta Town Hall. The children will be watering the garden 1-2 times per week. Eventually enjoying the veggies.

- Children are not to bring hand held games or cell phones to camp.
- Children must wear sneakers to camp.
- Remember lunch, snacks and drink every day.

Discipline Policy

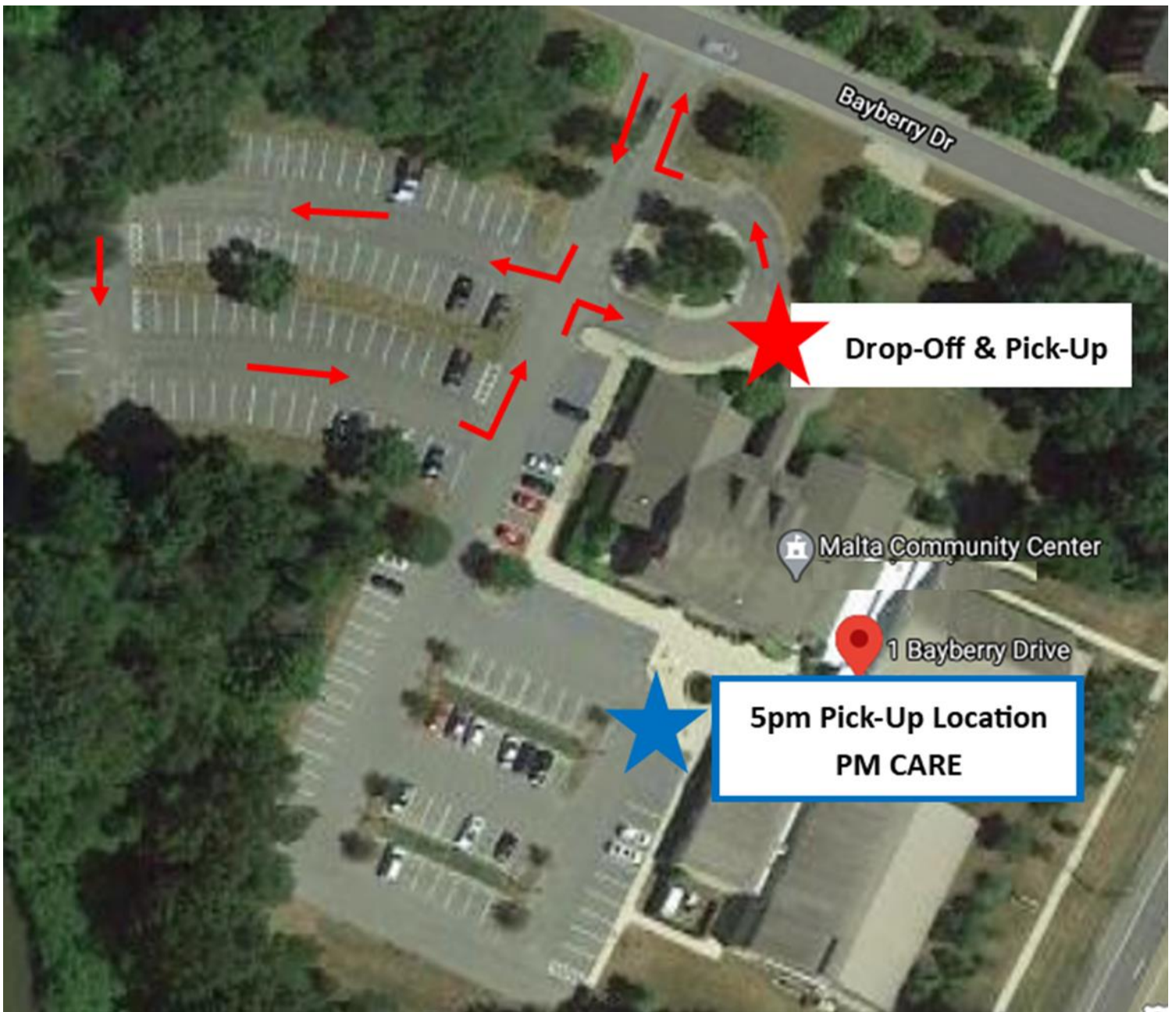
Your Parent Handbook has a list of all the rules and regulations regarding Camp Malta.

The children have individual counselors. The counselor will keep you informed of your child's day at camp. If there is an infraction of the rules by a camper, the counselor may contact the parent at the end of the camp. The camp rules and regulations are reviewed with the campers each

day. Please make sure child is aware of the camp policies and understands the rules of the camp.

From the Parent Manual: Because there are some children enrolled at Camp with nut allergies, it is extremely important that your child's snacks do not contain any nut products or oils. Although the Town of Malta endeavors to provide nut free programs, the Town cannot guarantee that the program or the premises in which it is held is totally free of exposure to nuts and nut-products. The Town of Malta encourages you to send whole foods such as fruits.

Camp Malta Drop-Off and Pick Up Procedure



Morning Drop-Off

- Parents/Guardians will remain in the cars unless the child needs assistance getting out of the car

AM Care Drop Off: 8:00am – 8:15am

Regular Camp Drop Off: 8:55am – 9:15am

If you arrive for drop-off outside of these times:

- Remain in your car and call the front office at 518-899-4411. A staff member will come outside.

Afternoon Pick-Up

- Parents/Guardians will remain in the cars unless the child needs assistance getting in the car
- Staff members will escort campers to the car

Regular Camp Pick Up: 3:55pm – 4:05pm

PM Care Pick Up: Remain in your car and call the front office at 518-899-4411. Please note different pickup location on map

From the Parent Handbook:

Since staff is not scheduled to watch children beyond the programmed camp time, an additional \$5 late fee is charged for each five-minute increment that you are late. Payment for a late pick-up is due the following day. If the designated pick up person is expected to be late, the parent or caretaker must call and inform staff what time to expect the child to be picked up and/or what alternate transportation arrangements have been made. If your child has not been picked up by 4:30pm and we cannot reach you, individuals on your emergency contact list will be called to pick your child up. In the event we are unable to reach you or an emergency contact by 6:00pm, the Saratoga County Sheriff and/or the Child Protective Services will be contacted.
